KnoxData is a data science meetup covering machine learning and advanced visualizations. It's open to anybody interested in the multidisciplinary field of data science.
















Knoxville Entrepreneur Center

The Knoxville Technology Council (KTech) connects, develops, promotes, and advocates for the technology industry in the Greater Knoxville region. KTech unites the region's technology leaders and empowers businesses and entrepreneurs through networks, events, and resources.

Knoxville Chamber

With more than 2.200 member businesses. the Knoxville Chamber serves as the collective, influential voice for the regional business community.

KnoxDevs

A nonprofit umbrella organization of groups that connect and support software developers in Knoxville, TN.

Innov865 Alliance

The Innov865 Alliance develops, supports, and promotes the Knoxville region's entrepreneurial ecosystem. It is a collaborative effort to celebrate and showcase Knoxville as a great place for entrepreneurs to start and grow businesses and increase access to capital. Innov865 Week is our signature event: however, the Alliance coordinates other activities throughout the year, including pitch competitions, educational opportunities, and social events.

The Anderson Center's mission is to foster an

Partnering with Entrepreneur Centers in seven regions (including the Knoxville Entrepreneur Center), LaunchTN creates collaboration among entrepreneurs. the private sector, capital sources, institutions, and government to offer entrepreneurs what they need to succeed and stay in Tennessee to build companies and create jobs. Its website also includes a startup Jobs Board.











Knox Makers

Knox Makers is a place for the Knoxville area's engineers, artists, hobbyists, innovators, educators and entrepreneurs to work and play. It is a technology and art collective dedicated to the promotion of creativity, enabled and informed by science. Its lectures, workshops, and outreach programs inspire and educate both members and the general public.



The SCORE Greater Knoxville Chapter has over 50 experienced business men and women who volunteer their time to provide a free consulting service to East Tennessee small business owners.

Bunker Labs Knoxville

Bunker Labs is a national network of veteran and mil-spouse entrepreneurs dedicated to helping the military community start their own business. The organization is committed to seeing that every entrepreneur in the military community has the network, tools, and resources they need to start their own business.

Knoxville Area Urban League

The Knoxville Area Urban League, an affiliate of the National Urban League, is dedicated to empowering communities and changing lives. Its mission is to enable African Americans, other minority groups and the under-served to secure economic selfreliance, parity, power and civil rights.

It supports the work of 400+ organizations.

It educates public officials and business leaders about Tennessee's advanced energy assets, establishes strategic partnerships to connect assets with opportunities, and informs policy that expands and strengthens the industry.








Technology Cooperative

SBIR/STTR Matching Fund



The SBIR/STTR Matching Fund program is a strategic initiative to advance the commercialization of innovations across the state. Developed and administered by LaunchTN, the program is funded for FY20 at \$3 million through the Tennessee Department of Economic and Community Development.

Innovation Capital Continuum



The Innovation Capital Continuum includes three equity initiatives: the Impact Fund, the Blended Capital Fund, and the Follow-on Fund. The Impact Fund focuses on Tennessee-based seed-stage ventures in the areas of agriculture, healthcare, sustainability, education, clean energy, financial inclusion, and more. The Blended Capital Fund (BCF) provides a customized investment solution for otherwise under-resourced early-stage companies. The Follow-on Fund (FoF) provides capital to companies in which LaunchTN already holds an equity position.

Commercialization Microgrants



The LaunchTN Commercialization Microgrants program is available to qualifying Tennesseebased early-stage companies that are developing technology with a plan for advancing it into the marketplace.

Graves Business Plan Competition



The Graves Business Plan Competition offers University of Tennessee, Knoxville students enrolled in undergraduate and master's degree programs the opportunity to win start-up capital for an original business idea. Prizes are awarded for first, second, and third place in two business categories: growth and lifestyle.

Boyd Venture Challenge



The Boyd Venture Challenge is a seed-fund grant competition for University of Tennessee, Knoxville student-owned companies that is conducted annually during the spring semester. Companies are awarded up to \$20,000 in startup capital. Funds may be awarded to one company or split among several companies.

VolCourt



Vol Court is a six-week entrepreneurial speaker series that culminates in a pitch competition. Participants put what they've learned into practice by pitching their business ideas to a panel of successful entrepreneurs for a chance to win \$1,500, office space in the University of Tennessee Research Foundation Business Incubator, and valuable professional services.

The Development Corporation of Knox County



The principal role of TDC is to ensure the availability of suitable sites within Knox County for the recruitment of new companies and the retention of existing companies that will result in direct and measurable increases in quality jobs.

Ballard Innovation Award



The Ballard Innovation Award competition is open to any early-stage company in the East Tennessee area that has established a "proof of concept" with accompanying revenue. The award is named in honor of Tom Ballard, PYA's Chief Alliance Officer and well-respected member of the East Tennessee entrepreneurial community. First place wins a \$50,000 package of capital and services.
