ORDINANCE NO:

WHEREAS, Section 401 of the Charter of the City of Knoxville requires that the City of Knoxville be divided into six (6) Councilmanic Districts which shall be designated by numbers from one through six; and

WHEREAS, Section 7.5-5 of the Knoxville City Code sets forth the wards included within each Councilmanic District; and

WHEREAS, Section 704 of the Charter of the City of Knoxville provides that councilmanic districts shall be reapportioned every ten (10) years based upon the most recent federal census; and

WHEREAS, Section 704 requires the preparation of a redistricting ordinance providing for districts which are relatively compact, contiguous, representative of social and community interests, and as equal in population as reasonably practicable; and

WHEREAS, the decennial federal census for 2020 has been completed; and

WHEREAS, the population of each of the six Councilmanic Districts according to the 2020 Census, as well as a copy of the current Councilmanic District maps, are attached hereto within Exhibit A; and

WHEREAS, that census information reflects that, despite population growth within the City, the current Councilmanic Districts remain relatively compact, contiguous, representative of social and community interests and as equal in population as reasonably practicable; and

WHEREAS, allowing the currently existing Councilmanic Districts to remain intact will not only satisfy all legal districting requirements but also will serve to eliminate the voter confusion naturally occurring when voting district boundaries are modified; and

WHEREAS, this redistricting plan establishes Councilmanic Districts which are relatively compact, contiguous, representative of social and community interests, and as equal in population as reasonably practicable; and

WHEREAS, this redistricting plan is reflected in Exhibit A, which has been prepared based upon information from the 2020 Census.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF KNOXVILLE:

SECTION 1: Section 7.5-5 of the Knoxville City Code is hereby amended by deleting the language of said Section in its entirety and replacing said language with the following:

Sec. 7.5-5 The City of Knoxville is hereby divided into the following Councilmanic Districts, which are numbered one through six, the boundaries of which are more specifically shown in Exhibit A which is attached to this Ordinance and specifically incorporated. The Councilmanic Districts hereby created are relatively compact, contiguous, representative of social and community interests, and as equal in population as reasonably practicable.

District 1

A part of 10-S, being the entire portion of said ward except that portion located on the University of Tennessee Campus southeast of Andy Hold Avenue, southwest of Lake Loudon Boulevard, and south of the intersection of Volunteer Boulevard and Pat Head Summitt Street.
